Rich countries spend 16 times more on aid to their own farmers than they do on aid to Africa. Unfair trade rules and practices stop African farmers competing equally. Many of Africa's poorest people make their living from farming. Without fairer trade rules, such as removing trade barriers and unfair subsidies, African farmers will remain poor because they cannot sell their goods on the world market.
